COLLEGE & CAREER

A Mount St. Mary's representative visited FHS today to meet with 7 applicants in person to offer possible admission into their school. The rep had one-on-one conversations with the students and offered financial aid options alongside an option of admission at one of their two campuses.

For the Fall of 2017, El Camino College will have an application workshop for students who wish to enroll. El Camino held an orientation today, and will be here tomorrow for Seniors who need to take the required assessment tests and meet with a counselor to create the Fall course lists. Finally, El Camino will also be having an education plan workshop on Thursday, January 26 and will be having a table outside during lunch on Thursday, January 26 and Thursday, February 9.

For the Spring of 2017, El Camino College will have an Application Workshop for on-site courses on Wednesday, February 1. In addition, they will be having an orientation for concurrent enrollment for Spring. There will be an El Camino field trip to both of the campuses, Compton and Torrance centers on Thursday, February 2, where students who are interested in El Camino will receive a tour.

Princeton Review will be offering test prep classes for 100 Juniors on Mondays and Wednesdays. The first class will start on Monday, January 30.

On January 21st, CalSOAP held a workshop to help students with financial aid needs. Students were given the chance to complete their financial aid or Dream Act application.
